<i>Educational Requirements for 10-level General Education Social Science Courses:</i>	Bachelor's degree in Psychology, Sociology, Political Science, Economics, History, Anthropology, Geography, Philosophy, Law, Religious Studies or a closely related field with a minimum of eighteen credits in the discipline being taught is required. Master's degree in Psychology, Sociology, Political Science, Economics, History, Anthropology, Geography, Philosophy, Law, Religious Studies or a closely related field with a minimum of eighteen graduate credits in the discipline being taught is preferred.
<i>Educational Requirements for 20-level Liberal Arts Social Science Courses:</i>	Master's degree in Psychology, Sociology, Political Science, Economics, History, Anthropology, Geography, Philosophy, Law, Religious Studies or a closely related field with a minimum of eighteen graduate credits in the discipline being taught is required.
<i>Occupational Experience:</i>	Experience in post-secondary teaching is preferred.
