Educational Requirements:	Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice or a closely related field is required. Master's degree in Criminal Justice is preferred. In evaluating candidates for this position, Nicolet may consider a combination of education, training, and experience that provides the necessary knowledge, skills, and abilities to perform the duties of the position.
Occupational Requirements:	An occupational instructor shall have two years (4,000 hours) of verifiable occupational work experience as a fully qualified worker in each law enforcement/corrections area. Occupational experience must include one year (2,000 hours) within the past five years. Recent teaching experience in post-secondary higher education may be substituted for up to one year of the occupational experience requirement.
