Master's degree in Industrial Safety, Occupational Safety, or Education is preferred. In evaluating candidates for this position, Nicolet may consider a combination of education, training, and experience that provides the necessary knowledge, skills, and abilities to perform the duties of the position.
Occupational Requirements:	Two years (4,000 hours) of verified occupational work experience as an Occupational Health and Safety Specialist is required. Experience must be in Industrial Safety or related occupations. Occupational experience must include one year (2,000 hours) within the past five years. Recent teaching experience in post-secondary higher education may be substituted for up to one year of the occupational experience requirement. Additional experience in OSHA, NFPA, DSPS, EPA, or DOT outside the field of education is preferred.
