**Processing of your aid has stopped until this form and all required documentation is returned to the Nicolet College Financial Aid Office.**

Your 2020–2021 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. The law says that before awarding Federal Student Aid, we may ask you to confirm the information you and your parents reported on your FAFSA. To verify that you provided correct information, the Financial Aid Office will compare your FAFSA with the information on this worksheet along with any other required documents. If there are differences, your FAFSA information may need to be corrected. You and at least one parent must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form and other required documents to the Nicolet College Financial Aid Office. Nicolet College may ask for additional information. If you have questions about verification, contact the Financial Aid Office as soon as possible so that your financial aid will not be delayed.

Follow the instructions to determine if you are eligible to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer 2018 IRS income tax information into your FAFSA. If you need more information about when, or how to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool contact the Financial Aid Office.

If your parents filed separate 2018 tax returns, you must submit tax returns for both parents if they live in the same household.
