

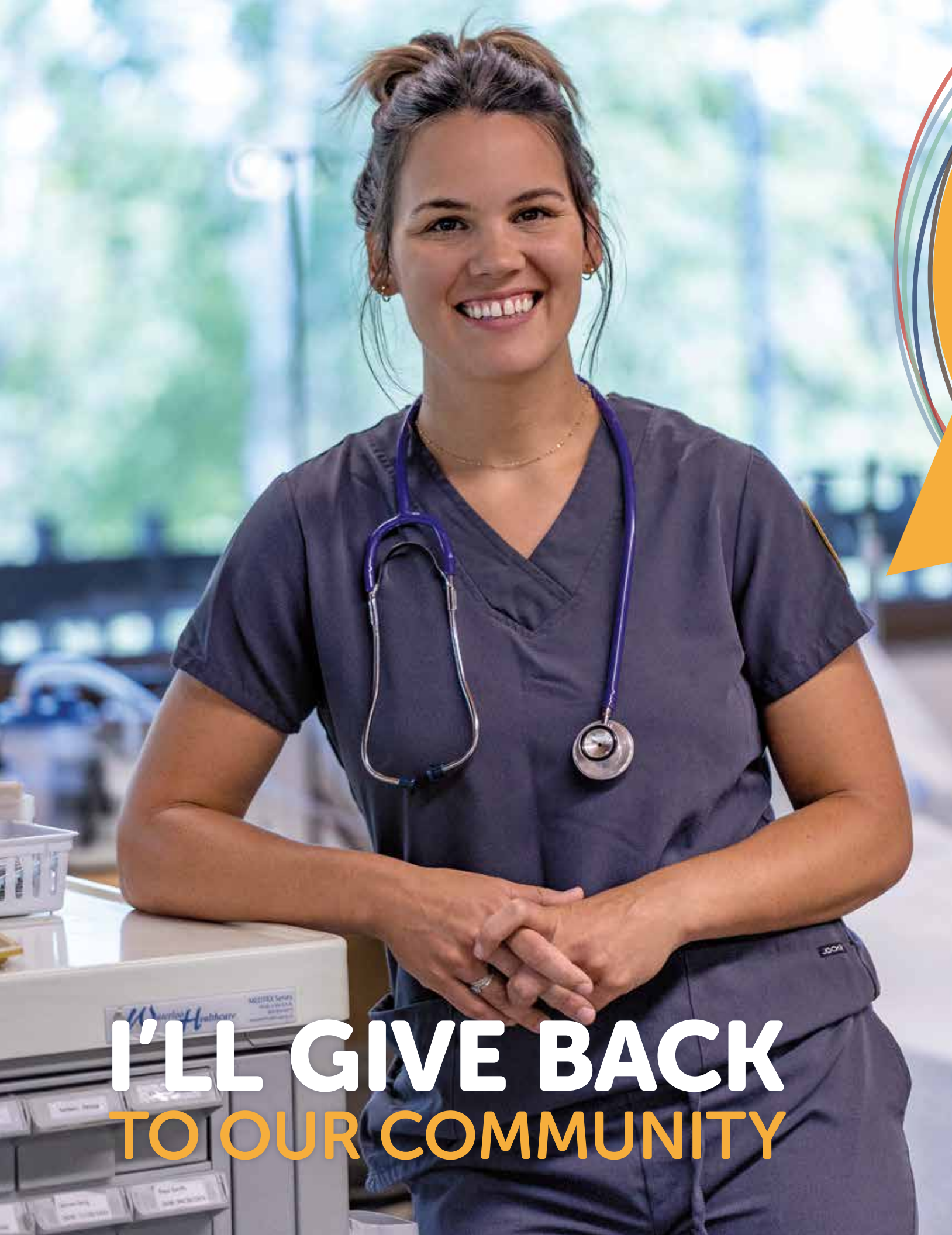

THE GIFT OF KNOWLEDGE

Gary Jirschele was living in Park Falls when an injury at work forced him to think about making some changes. In 2015, he moved to Rhinelander and started attending Nicolet College. "I was a little afraid of going back to school at my age, but once I started here, everybody was so nice, and they really help you succeed. The instructors are fantastic," Gary says.

It wasn't easy, and he says, "Money was a little short when I was going to Nicolet. There was a point that I wasn't sure whether I was going to finish at Nicolet, and I came and talked to the Foundation, so I was able to complete. It helped me."

Gary earned three technical diplomas, all in Information Technology, and after completing his third credential in 2017, he moved to Unalaska, AK to become the city's facilities maintenance manager. He says he uses what he learned here at Nicolet College every day.

Two years later, Gary made his first donation to the Nicolet College Foundation. "It definitely helped me with the cost of tuition. That's why I feel I should give back. It helps other students, and what better gift is there than the gift of knowledge?"

Gary believes in lifelong learning and still comes home to Rhinelander twice a year. He plans to move back here in a few years and may even enroll in classes at Nicolet College again. Gary explains, "I'm very proud to be an alumni of Nicolet College. In my job, I'm helping daily with people's problems and what they want to do. I just feel that's the way the world should be. It's important to give because I know it's important to someone else."

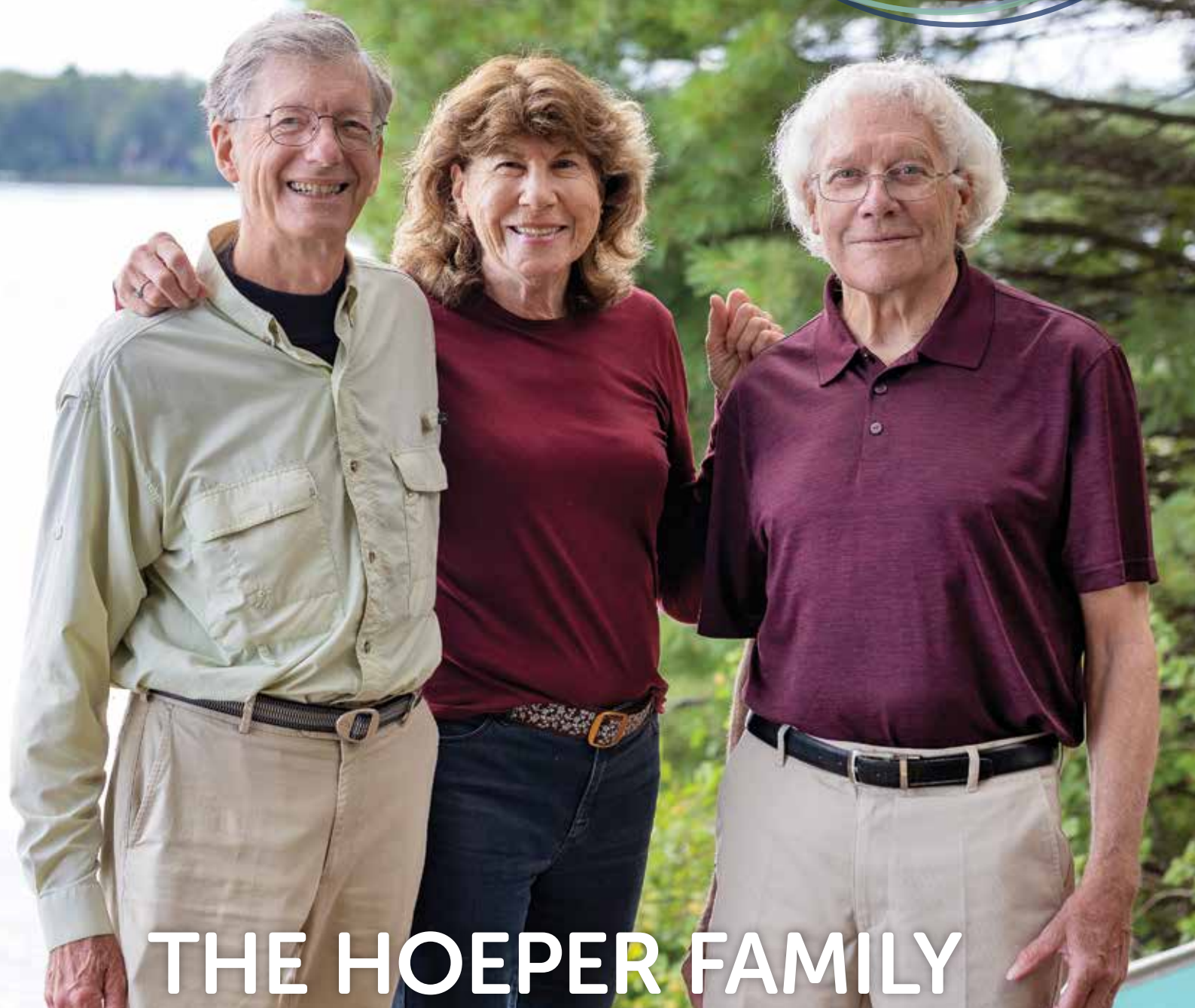
Gary continues to honor the assistance he received as a student and gives to the Nicolet College Foundation because he knows how much it helps.

THE HOEPER FAMILY LEGACY

The Pat Hoeper Memorial Endowed Scholarship has been awarded for 39 years. That's 39 students who have received this scholarship. It all goes back to 1983, when Jill Hoeper established this scholarship, but truly, it goes back much further.

Jill was born in Wausau and after earning her nursing degree at Johns Hopkins Medical School, she enlisted in the U.S. Army Air Corps in 1941 and served as a flight nurse. Jill was one of very few female commissioned officers in the U. S. Army. She married Paul Edward "Pat" Hoeper, who was a P-51 fighter pilot, in 1944. She supported his 20-year Air Force career, which included assignments at air bases around the U.S., the Pentagon, and Okinawa.

They retired in the Northwoods, but Jill never slowed down. Her family says she enjoyed swimming, wind surfing, and tennis into her 80s.

Pat was friends with Richard Brown, Nicolet College's first president, and when Pat passed away, Jill wanted to honor Pat by establishing a scholarship for nursing students. Pat and Jill's son, Page, says, "She thought a wonderful way to honor dad's memory would be to start a nursing scholarship, and really, so much of her life and his life were spent up here in the Northwoods, that it seemed obvious that Nicolet was the place to try to start that." Jill originally told the Foundation, "Pat was always a person who believed strongly in service to others and this is a way to keep that alive. We had thought of giving the money to our alma maters, but then we decided no. We love this area, we love Nicolet, and we've always felt that community colleges are so very important."

We share Jill's words today with students, "The idea is that the money goes to help someone get an education, who will then go on to help others." That's exactly what this scholarship has done. This year's recipient, Alexandra Fugle, says, "Mr. and Mrs. Hoeper were an admirable couple who gave much for others in their service to our country. They continue to touch people's lives through their scholarship endowment. I am deeply touched by Mr. and Mrs. Hoeper's lives and their gift. I am determined more than ever to work hard and serve others as an ongoing tribute to them. I am humbled to be a recipient of their legacy."

Jill passed away in September of 2021, at the age of 101, and the endowed scholarship was renamed in memory of both Pat and Jill. All three of the Hoeper's sons, Page, Peter, and Jeff, along with Page's wife Barbara and Jeff's wife Susan, are also Nicolet College Foundation donors. "My mother always spoke very highly of Nicolet and your program, and your contribution to the community, which I think you make an important difference, and she wanted to support that, and we're happy to contribute to the support of your students," Peter says.

Page adds, "This community is important to us as a family. Nicolet is important in creating what this area needs." More than 75% of Nicolet College graduates stay in the Nicolet District to live and work. That's an impact that reaches far beyond 39 scholarship recipients served by the Hoeper family.
