Delivery Methods:									

Class

Face to face learning and instruction delivered at scheduled times and locations.

CBE Class

Competencies with instruction 100% face-to-face. Instruction and assessments are completed at scheduled locations and times.

CRF FIAV

Flexible lab/class instruction with assessments completed at a personalized pace in an online and in person environment.

CRF Online

Competencies with instruction 100% online (excluding any one-time face-to-face orientation or off-line testing/evaluation). Online instruction and assessments are completed at an individualized pace, within the term enrolled, and accessed via the internet (by the student using a web browser).

Rlender

Courses that combine online and face-to-face instruction (not including any one-time face-to-face orientation or off-line testing/evaluation). Less than 50% of course instruction is delivered via online using the Internet (accessed by the student using a Web browser), combined with face-to-face instruction.)

Field

Learning experiences take place at an off-campus setting. Field courses include but are not limited to clinical, practicum, preceptorship, internship and study abroad.

Hybrid

Courses that combine online and face-to-face instruction (not including any one-time face-to-face orientation or off-line testing/evaluation). At least 50% but less than 100% of course instruction is delivered via online using the Internet (accessed by the student using a Web browser), combined with face-to-face instruction.

IA

Complete coursework via independent study, connecting with the instructor regularly. Please connect with the instructor during the first week of class.

Online

Online courses are defined as 100% of the instruction delivered via the Internet and accessed by the student using a Web browser. A one-time face-to-face course orientation or off-line supervised tests/exams at specified sites may be conducted in conjunction with these courses.

Off Campus

Some or all of the class meetings take place at a location not on the Nicolet campus in Rhinelander.
